
FROM THE PILLAR OF BEAUTY

Greetings Brethren;

January 7th, was the installation of our Officers in the South, myself as Junior Warden; Mario Urbino as Senior Steward; and Aaron Thomas as Junior Steward. I welcome these two Brothers to their chairs in our Lodge, and thank all who have helped us achieve our respective places.

This month I present for your consideration the use of the square and compass to derive the square root of a number. Consider the rectangle shown below, with sides AB=2 and BC=1. From this construct a circle with diameter AB+BC=3. The length of the perpendicular BD= square root of 2. The square with sides BD has the same area as the original rectangle. This method is known as "Squaring the Rectangle"
