Here is what I learned:



S.W. HACKETT'S NEW BROTHER, NICHOLAS BAKER.



On May 19th, 2015, Samuel Warren Hackett and the fraternity gained a new Brother as Nicholas Baker was initiated an Entered Apprentice Mason.

Brother Baker was obligated an Entered Apprentice Mason by Brother Charles Caskey, Junior Warden, who did a great job on his first time in the East, with the open, obligation and close.

Worshipful Robert Salini, Master, presented an excellent first degree lecture. Brother John Fitch, Senior Warden, delivered a perfect Charge.

Seven Doors into Freemasonry?

There are perhaps greater variation in our Masonic Ritual than one might expect. The causes may be traced to the first Grand Lodge of 1717, the joining or union with the Antients and Modern Grand Lodges in 1813.

Also of Continental Masons of Europe to expand and both simplify the Ritual and our American New World experience. K. W. Henderson, in his "Masonic World Guide" states "There are in excess of 100 different rituals in use in the regular Masonic world."

First is the "American" used in the U.S., Japan, Philippines, & Finland, exception of NY City, New Orleans & Pennsylvania. The Second is "England", estimated to have 50 rituals in use and are similar most of which are classified under the works of Emulation, Staybility, Lodgic, Benefactum, Ritis Oxoniensis, Taylor's West End with Bristol being the most divergent. Third is "Scotland" which maintains more operative features and includes the Mark Master in its degrees. Forth is "Ireland which maintains uniform work throughout with the exception of Munster where its work resembles that of Bristol.

Fifth is French of which are Ecossais or Scottish Rite work used in Greece, New York, New Orleans, California & Floridia, there is also the Modern French Rite used in Greece, Luxembourg & France & Rectified Scottish Rite.

Sixth is Anglo-Continental Ritual of the Netherlands next are F. Schroeder's & I. A. Fessler's reformed for simplicity of German rituals next is the Guild DE Gamle Pligter in some lodges in Denmark as an alternative to the Swedish Rite used by it's Grand Lodge. Seventh is the Swedish Rite worked in some German Lodges, in Spain & all but one Scandinavian Grand Lodges Latin America uses mostly Scottish Rite &Rectified Scottish Rite with some refer to asYork Rite being either Emulation or of Webb. ~Abridged from "The Masonic Trowel"~

SW HACKETT LODGE PICNIC


Whence Came You To Santee Lakes.
